## WhAT YOU'LL NEED

- A small paintbrush or cotton swab
- Paint (any color)
- Several printed copies of these activity sheets


## WHAT TO DO

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Paint some spots on one of the ladybug's wings. You can find the ladybug on page 2 of this activity.

Before the paint dries, fold your paper in half along the dotted line, so the paint drops make matching spots on the other wing.


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Try it again on another clean drawing of the ladybug. Can you make a ladybug with 6 spots total? How many spots should you paint on the first side to end up with 6 spots all together?
